## Seedlings, shrubs, and more....

The District is offering some new selections as well as many varieties that we offer each year. These seedlings are sold in packets of 10 seedlings and sell for a minimal price. Deadline for ordering is **March 31, 2010**, but order early as they are sold on a first come-first served basis and many seedlings will be sold out before that date. Pickup is **Friday, April 16, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.** and **Saturday, April 17 - 8:00 a.m. - Noon.** at Geig's Orchard, 8468 Wooster Pike (State Route 3), Seville. Most seedlings will easily fit in a grocery sack. Note pick-up hours. The District cannot be responsible for survival of the seedlings after pickup.

*No pick-up notice will be mailed.*

*Deadline for ordering is March 31, 2010.*

*All packets contain 10 seedlings approx. 12-18" in size*

### EVERGREENS

**A. Blue Spruce, *Picea pungens*:** Beautiful ornamental or windbreak tree with stiff, sharp pointed needles ranging in color from dark green to silver blue. Prefers moist, well-drained soils, plenty of sunlight, and requires little shaping; matures at 50-70 feet.

**B. Norway Spruce, *Picea abies*:** Exceptionally fast growing, straight stemmed stock makes this tree desirable for Christmas trees, ornamentals, timber or windbreaks. The twigs and branchlets hang downward; height of 60-90 feet.; intolerant of shade, sensitive to drought.

**C. Black Hills Spruce, *Picea glauca*:** Single, central trunk and a pyramid shape. Needles are short and stiff 1/3—3/4 inch long. Prefers full sun or partial shade on moist, well drained sandy, loam soils. Matures at 30-60 feet with 15-25 foot spread.

**D. White Pine, *Pinus strobus*:** A five-needled pine with soft, light green needles 4" long. Likes full sun, ordinary soil; can tolerate wet areas. Excellent as ornamental tree or trimmed as a shrub; mature height is 100 feet.

**E. Balsam Fir, *Abies balsamea*:** A slow growing evergreen with 1" dark green needles; grows best in moist, well drained soils; needs protection from drying winds. Will grow 40-70 feet tall with a 15-20 foot spread.



### HARDWOODS

**F. Northern Red Oak, *Quercus rubra*:** Leaves are 5-8 inches long with 7-11 lobes; This long-lived shade tree will reach 80-90 feet with a 3 foot trunk. Tolerates city conditions making it an excellent street or yard tree; provides valuable lumber, wildlife food and shelter.

**G. Sugar Maple, *Acer rubrum*:** Growth rate is medium to fast with mature heights of 80-100 feet. It produces small red flowers in early spring and leaves turn a brilliant red in fall. Tolerates most soils from wetlands to rocky upland or lime soils; excellent shade ornamental; wildlife habitat.

**H. American Sycamore, *Platanus occidentalis*:** This fast growing and long lived tree can grow to 100' with a spread of 30' to 80' on good sites. They will grow very well in wet sites. The leaves are very large and maple like and the bark peels away for a mottled patchwork effect.

**I. Littleleaf Linden, *Tilia cordata*:** This tree has dense and compact foliage with a pyramidal shape. It grows in a wide variety of soils and is highly tolerant to adverse conditions, such as those found in cities. It will grow 50' -60' high with a 40' spread.

**J. Black Walnut, *Juglans nigra*:** A rapidly growing tree when young that is prized for its lumber and edible nuts. Prefers deep, moist, rich, well-drained soil but can tolerate many soil conditions. Can reach heights to 70' with a 70'.spread. Requires full sun.



### HARDWOODS cont.

**K. Eastern Redbud, *Cercis canadensis*:** A beautiful harbinger of spring, this small tree matures at about 15 feet and branches into irregularly shaped limbs close to the ground. Produces pink flowers before it leaves out.

**L. Allegheny serviceberry, *Amelanchier laevis*:** A shorter tree growing only 15-25 feet tall with the same spread with irregular growth habits. Small white flowers in the spring with berries turning magenta to purple that attract birds. Prefers sun to partial shade, moist soil, but will tolerate a range of soil types.

**M. Common witchhazel, *Hamamelis virginiana*:** This deciduous tree will reach 15-30 feet with a 15-25 foot spread. Prefers sun to partial shade, moist, well-drained soil. Most cold hardy of all witch hazels. In the fall you will see 1" fragrant creamy to bright yellow flowers.

### SHRUBS

**N. Arrowwood viburnum, *Viburnum dentatum*:** rounded, dense shrub with arching branches. It will grow 6-8' tall and 8-10' wide, flowers in late May with fruit turning blue in late summer that birds like; prefers loamy soil and ample moisture in sun or shade.

**O. Common lilac, *Syringa vulgaris*:** this shrub will mature at 8'-15' with a compact growth habit. Plant in full sun with good air circulation. Will produce lilac colored blossoms in spring.

**P. Silky dogwood, *Cornus amomum*:** native hardy shrub that tolerates partial shade. In spring it displays attractive white flower clusters and blue fruit in fall that is attractive to wildlife. Matures at 10' with a fast growth habit.

## MISCELLANEOUS Sale Items

**T. Flags** (10) - Flags are 21" long with a blue flag for easy spotting of your seedlings in yards and fields.

**U. Fertilizer tablets** (10) - Time release tablets for trees and other plants. The formula contains nitrogen, phosphorous, potassium, and trace elements in solid form to feed plants in a wide range of soil and climate conditions. Use one tablet per seedlings, transplants, and other wood cuttings. One tablet for each 1/2 inch diameter of trunk for larger trees and evergreens.

**V. Tree Root Gel** (4 ounce packet) - One packet can do one 5-gallon container or be measured for smaller containers and seedlings (2 T per each seedling or 2 qt. container.) This product will help the soil and roots maintain moisture while it fertilizes the plant. Use it by mixing with the soil you are planting into.

**W. Bluebird House** (each) - these houses are made from cedar. The ideal location is near mixed hardwood forests or grasslands. Boxes should be mounted on posts about 5 feet above the ground.

**X. Northeast Perennial & Annual Wildflower mix** (1 ounce packet) - This is a beautiful all-purpose wildflower mix, containing about 1/3 annual wildflowers for first year & 2/3 perennials for color the following years. This is a mix of native and naturalized species. Each packet will plant 200 sq. ft.

**Y. Tree Protector w/stakes** (10) - A 24" flat sheet of recycled polyethylene that is formed into a tube when placed around hardwoods. Protects new seedlings from deer rub and rodents and helps speed the growth of the seedling. Go to [www.treepro.com](http://www.treepro.com) for more information .
