

## Miscellaneous Sale Items

**X.-Y. Live Stakes:** Live stakes are a great tool for establishing a hearty root system on an eroding streambank or slope. Each live stake should be driven into the soil about 1/2 -2/3 the length of the stem. Spacing should be 2-3 feet apart. It may take a year or two before you see leaves, but the live stake should be building roots as soon as the first growing season. For more information call our office.

**I. Flags (10):** - Flags are 21" long with a flag for easy spotting of your seedlings in yards and fields.

**II. Fertilizer Tablets (10):** - Time release tablets for trees and other plants. The formula contains nitrogen, phosphorous, potassium, and trace elements in solid form to feed plants in a wide range of soil and climate conditions. Use one tablet per seedling, transplant, and other wood cutting.

**III. Tube Tree Protectors w/Stakes (10):** 4" in diameter and 28" tall, tube speeds photosynthesis and protects tree from animals, rodents and insects. Includes bamboo stakes and cable ties.

**IV. Bluebird House (each):** - these houses are made from cedar. The ideal location is near mixed hardwood forests or grasslands. Boxes should be mounted on posts about five feet above the ground.

**V. Seeds-Moist Meadow:** This native seed mix is perfect for those wet areas that stay moist for longer periods of time, making it perfect for converting that pesky wet spot that is a pain to mow to a place for pollinators and wildlife. This diverse mix invites wildlife like songbirds, and once established and matured (3-4 yrs), this seed mix is expected to bloom from June to October.

**VI. Seeds-Pollinator:** This beautiful wildflower mix includes a wide variety of species, all of which are native to Ohio. As its name suggests, this mix is great for starting a pollinator plot. Once established and matured (3-4 yrs), this seed mix is expected to bloom from April to October. The wide range of colors and bloom period can help support pollinators in your community.

**VII. Shiitake Mushroom kits:** Enjoy fresh, delicious gourmet mushrooms year-round. Each kit comes with 200 spawn plugs, 1/4 lb. bees wax, wax dauber, and 5 metal labels with growers guide. Each kit will plug approximately ten 3" to 4" diameter logs, 40" long. It can take from 7 months to 2 years for the mushrooms to spawn. Logs (you supply) that will work include white oak, bur oak, swamp white oak, red & black oak, soft maple and hickory.

### **Soil Moisture Levels**

**Dry:** Very well-drained soils that rarely have standing water, even after a heavy rain event.

**Medium:** Well-drained soils, sometimes experiences standing water, but only for short periods of time.

**Moist:** Usually damp soils. Can have standing water for a few days after a heavy rain event. Surface can dry out in the summer.

**Wet:** Soil stays soggy most of the year, even through the summer. Experiences standing water for a week in the spring or after a heavy rain event.

### **Growth Rate**

Fast is typically a growth rate of greater than 24" in height a year.

Moderate is typically a growth rate of 13-24" in height a year.

Slow is typically a growth rate of less than 12" in height a year.

### **Deadline for ordering is March 31, 2025.**

Seedlings are sold on a first-come first-served basis.  
Many of the seedlings are sold out before the order deadline.
