Seedlings, shrubs, and more....

The District is offering some new selections as well as many varieties that we offer each year. Deadline for ordering is **April 1, 2020**, but order early as they are sold on a first come-first served basis and many seedlings will be sold out before that date. Pickup dates for seedlings are **Friday, April 24, 8:00 a.m. -6:00 p.m.** and **Saturday, April 25 - 8:00 a.m. - Noon** at **Geig's Orchard, 8468 Wooster Pike (State Route 3), Seville**. Most seedlings will easily fit in a grocery sack.

The District is not responsible for survival of the seedlings after pickup. *Each packet contains 10 seedlings

No pick-up notice will be mailed. ** **Deadline for ordering is April 1, 2020

A. Blue Spruce, *Picea pungens*: Beautiful ornamental or windbreak tree with stiff, sharp pointed needles ranging in color from dark green to silver blue. Prefers moist, well-drained soils, plenty of sunlight, and requires little shaping.

B. Norway Spruce, *Picea abies*: Exceptionally fast growing, straight stemmed stock makes this tree desirable for Christmas trees, ornamentals, timber or windbreaks. The twigs and branchlets hang downward; height of 60-90 feet; intolerant of shade, sensitive to drought.

C. White Pine, *Pinus strobus*: A five-needled pine with soft, light green needles 4" long. Can tolerate shade, ordinary soil; even wet areas. Mature height is 100 feet.

D. Black Hills Spruce, *Picea glauca densata*: Slow growth to 40 feet with a spread of 15-25 feet. One of the most tolerant spruces, withstands wind, heat, cold, drought, and crowding; does best in full sun. Provides dense shelter for wildlife. Excellent farmstead windbreaks.

E. Canaan Fir, *Abies balsamea var. phanerolepis*: relatively dense, pyramidal conifer with a spire-like tip growing to a height of 40-55 feet. Spread 20 to 25 feet. Highly adaptable to many soil conditions even wet, poorly drained areas. Plant in shaded areas or direct sunlight. Suitable as an accent plant, screen or group planting.

F. Eastern Red Cedar, *Juniperus virginiana*: A dense pyramidal evergreen growing 40 to 50 feet. Spread of 8 to 20 feet. Should grow in almost any soil and does well in poor gravelly soils. Due to its fast dense growth, makes it a good choice for screen or hedge.

G. Bur Oak, *Quercus macrocarpa*: Growth to 70-80 feet. Plant in full to partial sun, capable of withstanding a wide range of harsh conditions. Good wildlife tree.

H. Pin Oak, *Quercus palustris*, Medium to rapid growth. Grows to a height of 70 feet with a spread of 40 feet. Prefers full to partial sun and wet soils.

I. Swamp White Oak, *Quercus bicolor*: Grows to 50-60 feet in height and spread. Does well in wet swampy conditions along rivers and streams.

J. River Birch, *Betula nigra*: Rapid growth, grows to a height of 50 feet with a spread of 40 feet. Prefers full to partial sun and moist to wet soils.

K. Silver Maple, *Acer saccharinum*: Very fast growing 50 to 70 feet tall, will grow in all soil types but grows best in moist, rich, well drained soil. Very popular shade tree.

L. Sugar Maple, *Acer saccharum*: Grows to a height of 60-75 feet. Spread of 45-50 feet. Mature trees provide sugar products from sap in the spring. A good timber tree. Does not do well in wet areas or in small compact restricted growing areas.

M. American Hornbeam, *Carpinus caroliniana*: Slow growing 20 to 30 feet in height and spread. Small, multi-stemmed, bushy shrub or single stemmed tree with a wide spreading, flat or round topped crown. Fall color yellow-orange, red and reddish purple. A good wetland plant.

N. Black Walnut, *Juglans nigra*: Fast growing to a height of 100 feet with a broad, open crown of almost equal spread. Grows best in deep, rich, moist soils. Produces large, rich, flavorful nuts. A highly valued hardwood.

O. Common Hackberry, *Celtis occidentalis*: Medium growth to a height of 80 feet and a spread of 60 feet. Prefers full sun and moist well drained soils. Very pollution tolerant. In mid to late autumn provides fruits for birds.

P. Paw Paw, *Asimina triloba*: Known for its banana like fruits, large tropical looking leaves and unique, red flowers.

Q. American Persimmon, *Diospyros virginiana*, Grows 25 to 40 feet in height and 20 to 35 in width. The white, fragrant flowers are very sweet and a favorite of honeybees. Edible fruit, and more than one tree is needed for pollination.

R. Quaking Aspen, *Populus tremuloides*: Fast growing to a height of 40 to 50 feet with a spread of 20 to 30 feet. Grows well in acidic, loamy, moist, sandy, well-drained and clay soils. It prefers abundant moisture. The tree is also a host to a myriad of birds and butterflies.

S. Redbud, *Cercis canadensis*: A small tree with irregular branching, rarely over 35 feet in height. The blossoms appear in the spring before the leaves. Seeds eaten by birds, flower buds enjoyed by butterfly larvae.

T. Shagbark Hickory, *Carya ouata*: Slow growth to a height of 100 feet with a spread of 40 feet. Prefers Full to partial sun and well drained moist to dry soils.

U. Staghorn Sumac, *Rhus typhina*: Rapid growth to a height and spread of 25 feet. Will grow in any soil type, full sun and thrives in unfavorable conditions like polluted city air.

V. Sycamore, *Platanus occidentalis*: A native fast growing tree with grayish bark that exfoliates to expose the inner creamy white bark. Tolerant of flooding, good along streams.

W. Tulip Poplar, *Liriodendron tulipifera*: Rapid growth, to a height of 80 feet with a spread of 40 feet. Prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soils. Spring flowers provide nectar for hummingbirds and the seeds summer through winter provide food for both birds and mammals.

X. Wild Black Cherry, *Prunus serotina*: Fast growing, grows to 60 feet. Grows best in rich, deep, moist soil. It has been prized in furniture making and is excellent firewood. Fruit provides food for many small animals.

Y. Arrowwood, *Viburnum dentatum*: A vigorous grower to 15 feet with a spread of 6 to 15 feet, with flat clusters of creamy-white flowers, early June. Birds relish the fruits and seeds, making this an excellent wildlife habitat.

Z. Black Chokeberry, *Aronia melanocarpa*: Fast growing to a height of 3 to 5 feet and a spread of 10 feet. Single white flowers in late May. Purplish-black berries in fall. Fall color wine red. Good for naturalizing, a fast screen, food for wildlife. Very adaptable species will grow on dry sandy hillsides. Good wetland plant.

AA. Button Bush, *Cephalanthus occidentalis*: Medium growth to a height of 7 feet with a spread of 15 feet. Grows in full sun. It is a wetland plant that has globular pure white flowers in the summer. Plant provides cover for ducks, flowers attracts bees, butterflies and birds.

BB. Gray Dogwood, *Cornus racemosa*: Fast growing to 15 feet. Very dense green foliage that turns purplish in fall. Numerous small white flower clusters, bloom in mid June, giving way to small white berries. Grows well in average soil. Very good for soil erosion. Wet tolerant.

CC. Ninebark, *Physocarpus opulifolius*: Grows to a height of 5-10 feet with a rounded shape. Small white flowers develop into red fruit in fall which provides food for wildlife. Plant in full sun to partial shade, very hardy and drought tolerant.

DD. Serviceberry, *Amelanchier Canadensis*: Grows to a height of 15-25' and a spread of 15-25' at a medium growth rate. Grows well in acidic, moist and well-drained soils.

EE. Spicebush, *Lindera benzoin*: Height of 6 to 12 feet. Deciduous shrub, very tolerant of wet conditions. Suitable for shady areas. Scarlet fruit fall through early winter.

FF. White Flowering Dogwood, *Cornus florida*: Native tree that bears white flowers in spring and red berries in fall. Shade tolerant.

GG. Winterberry, *Euonymus bungeanus*: Medium growth rate grows 18'-24' tall with 10'-12' spread. Rounded shape with slender branches. Tolerant of many soil conditions. Full sun to partial shade.

Miscellaneous Sale Items

I. Flags (10) - Flags are 21" long with a blue flag for easy spotting of your seedlings in yards and fields.

II. Fertilizer tablets (10) - Time release tablets for trees and other plants. The formula contains nitrogen, phosphorous, potassium, and trace elements in solid form to feed plants in a wide range of soil and climate conditions. Use one tablet per seedling, transplant, and other wood cutting.

III. Bluebird House (each) - these houses are made from cedar. The ideal location is near mixed hardwood forests or grasslands. Boxes should be mounted on posts about 5 feet above the ground.

IV. Northeast Perennial & Annual Wildflower mix (1 ounce packet) - This is a beautiful all-purpose wildflower mix, containing about 1/3 annual wildflowers for first year & 2/3 perennials for color the following years. This is a mix of native and naturalized species. Each packet will plant 200 sq. ft.

V. Garden cover crop seeds: (1 lb packet) - Garden Cover Crop Mixes help to reduce erosion and compaction, and increase water permeation in the garden. They also hold minerals normally leached from your soil over the winter. Densely planted cover crops will suppress perennial and winter annual weed growth. The top growth and roots add organic matter to the garden soil. The cover crop's root system also opens passageways that help improve air and water movement and supports microbial life. This microbial life works synergistically with the roots, bacteria and fungi to improve soil health. Mix contains untreated seeds suitable for organic gardeners, plant in August through October first, with no soil prep. Covers 200 sq. ft., winter kills. ****These will be available for pick up in June.****

VI. Shiitake Mushroom kits: Enjoy fresh, delicious gourmet mushrooms year-round. Each kit comes with 200 spawn plugs, 1/4 lb. bees wax, wax dauber, and 5 metal labels with growers guide. Each kit will plug approximately 10 3 to 4" diameter logs, 40" long. It can take from 7 months to 2 years for the mushrooms to spawn. Logs (you supply) that will work include white oak, bur oak, swamp white oak, red & black oak, soft maple and hickory.
