One part water

-OROne part Baking soda
Two Parts Vinegar

1/2 cup vinegar 1/2 cup borax Warm water Apply with Sponge or spray bottle

Oven Cleaner

2 Tbs liquid soap
1 tsp borax
1 quart warm water
Spray on surfaces and let sit for 20 minutes.
(Avoid using it on wires and heating elements.
